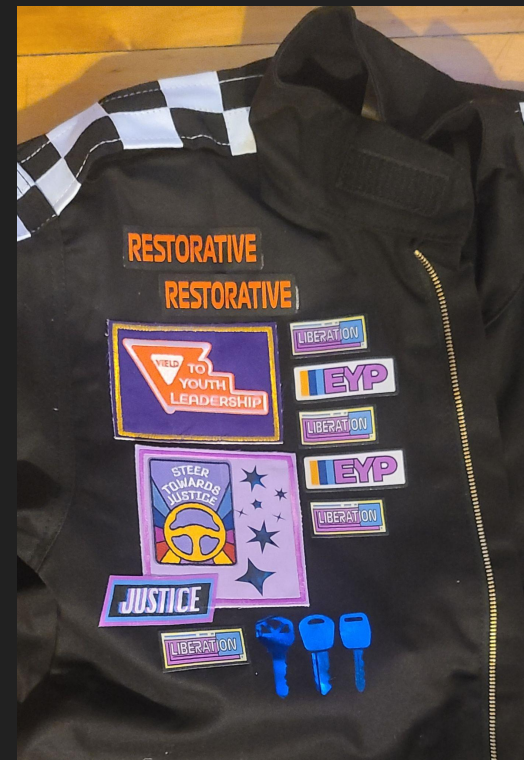


MN: End Youth Prisons MN & Amir Khadar

Race car Jacket Design



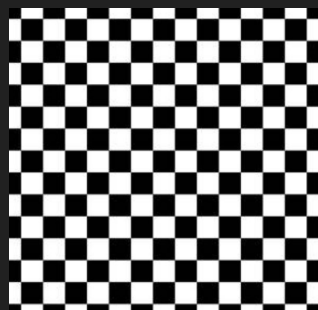
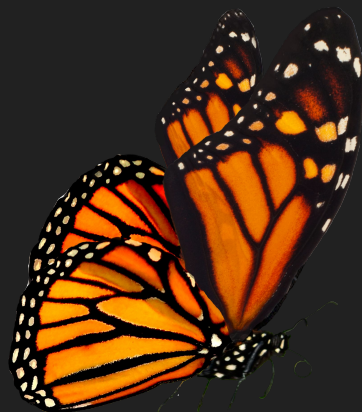
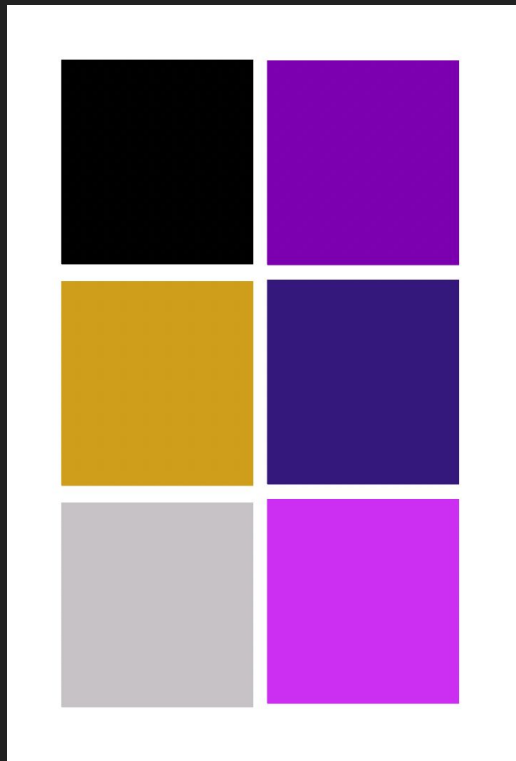

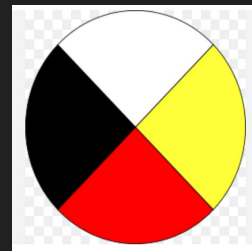

Medium weight cotton - Bomber fit

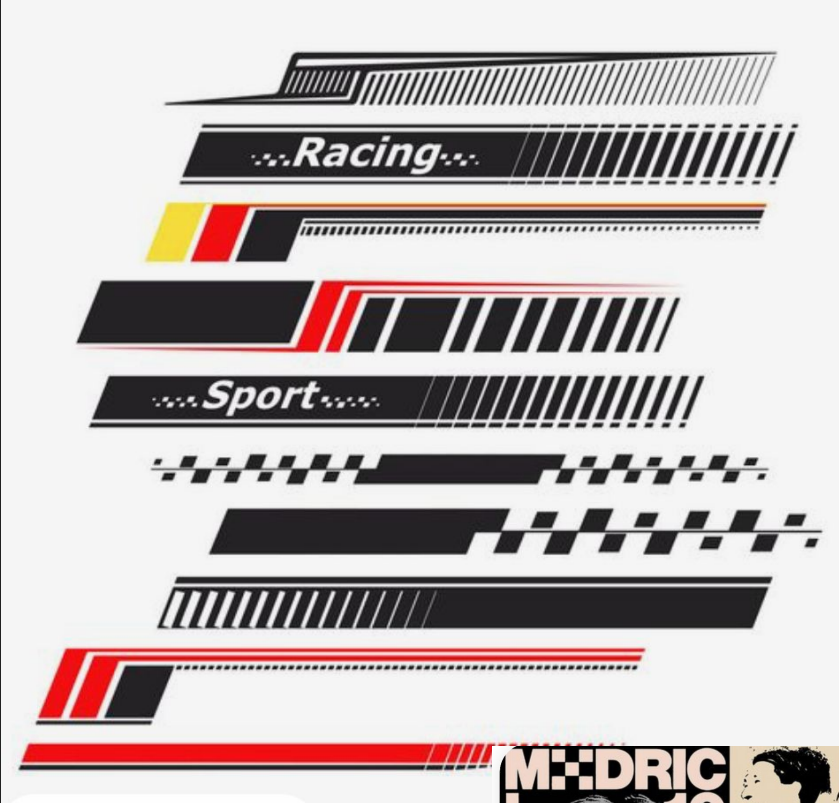


Adornment Options

Messaging >>> Design Assets :EYP MN decides

- **Uncuff the Future (back embroidery)**
- **Yield to Youth Leadership (patch like Yield sign)**
- **EYP (End Youth Prisons like Nascar patch in EYP colors)**
- **Restorative, Justice & Liberation (patches like sponsors)**
- **Steer towards Justice (big patch w/ steering wheel)**
- **Karner Blue butterfly (enamel pin)**
- **Medicine Wheel / Restorative Practice (Enamel pin)**
- **Fist of solidarity (pin)**
- **Vinyl: keys, stars, butterflies, area codes as street signs, checkerboards**

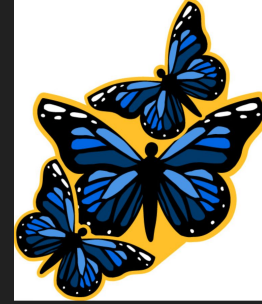

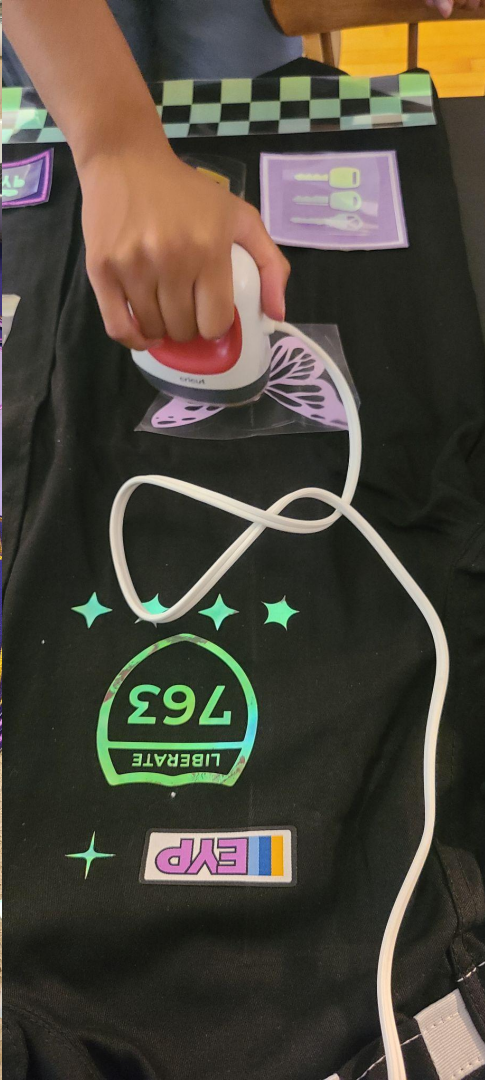
